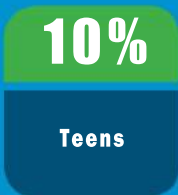
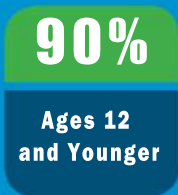
The Need in Our State

What We Do

Power Hour helps Club Members achieve academic success by providing homework help, tutoring and high yield learning activities and encouraging Members to become self-directed learners.

Our Impact

Among our twelfth-grade Club Members, all expect to graduate from high school, and 33% expect to complete some kind of post-secondary education.

3.3% of high-school youth in Kern County were suspended.

45% of Club teen members volunteer in their community at least once per month.

What we Do

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Kern County serve as sites and sponsors for the USDA meal and snack programs, providing healthy meals to children during out of school times, while also supporting educational and enrichment programs.

Our Impact

In an effort to help curb the food insecurities in Kern County, the Boys & Girls Club served 666,658 meals for children through 10 community serving sites (5 Club sites) in 2021.
